

2026 All-Star Game Facts & Trivia

- Crown was the game sponsor from 1982-2003, and in 2004, Geier Financial became the sponsor and the game was renamed the Brooks Robinson All-Star Game. MAI Capital Management was the sponsor from 2021-2023. ZIPS Cleaners has now assumed sponsorship.
- This year will be the 44th game played (there was no game in 2020 due to the global pandemic), and will be the tenth game played in July, the second on July 1st, the sixth on a weekday, and the first on a Wednesday. The earliest was May 31, 2015 and the latest start date was July 28, 1996. Two games, 1994 and 2013, were suspended due to weather and then completed on a later date.
- After this year, 1,332 players from 198 different schools will have played in the game.
- Ben Lopez is the first-ever selection from Severn Run.
- Arundel has had the most participants (81), followed by Calvert Hall (68), and Mount St. Joseph (67).
- Archbishop Spalding in 2016 and John Carroll in 2025 have had the most participants (five players and a coach) in a game from one school.
- 13 players on the 2026 PSAS team were selected for this year's game.
- The North won the first two games in 1982 & 1983, and has never trailed in the series. Currently, the North leads 21-18-3 with the 2006 game washed out after 2 innings. The most consecutive wins is four by the North (1990-93). The South's best winning streak is three (2002-04). The South has won the last two games.
- The most runs scored by both teams was in 2005 when the game ended in an 11-11 tie. 1984 had the least runs scored when the South won 1-0 (the run scored on a fielder's choice). The most runs scored by one team was in 2010, when the South won 16-3.
- Since the game was renamed in 2004, there have been five players with a first name of Brooks: Brooks Kerr (2012), Brooks Carey (2014), Brooks Carr (2015), Brooks Mueller (2025), and Brooks Ryan (2015), but no players with a last name of Robinson.
- Gavin Floyd (2001) and Jackson Merrill (2021) were both first round MLB draft selections within a month of playing in the game. Floyd was the 4th overall selection, and Merrill was the 27th overall selection.
- To date, thirty-two All-Star Game alumni have played in the majors:

- The most recent to make their MLB debut was Brady Feigl on August 26, 2024.
- The most recent game with a future MLB player was 2021 (Jackson Merrill).
- Seven All-Star Game alumni who have played in the majors are still active: Brady Feigl, Josh Hader, Tyler Locklear, Jackson Merrill, Ljay Newsome, LaMonte Wade Jr., and Bruce Zimmerman.
- The shortest time between playing in the game and their MLB debut is 4 years (Gavin Floyd and Jackson Merrill). The longest time between playing in the game and their MLB debut is 17 years (Brady Feigl).
- To date, 2012 has featured the most future major leaguers playing in one game (Josh Hader, Ryan Meisinger, & LaMonte Wade Jr.)
- Dallas Brooks of John Carroll and Charlie Buckles of Walt Whitman both hit home runs in last year's game (the first home runs hit since 2021), and the last triple was also last year by Mike Swick of Broadneck.
- The last time that a pitcher struck out the side was last year by Matt Russell of Reservoir.
