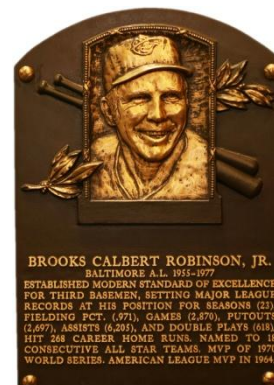

History

The idea of a state-wide all-star baseball game featuring high school seniors from public, private, and parochial schools representing every district in Maryland was conceived by former Arundel High School coach Bernie Walter, who also helped create the Maryland State Association of Baseball Coaches (MSABC) in 1981 and was the first MSABC President. Sponsorship of the game was obtained from Crown Central Petroleum Company. A spokesman for Crown at the time, Brooks Robinson, the Hall of Fame third baseman for the Orioles, became honorary chairman of the game.

The first annual Crown High School All-Star game was played in 1982 at Memorial Stadium between teams of high school seniors representing the North and the South. Growing in stature every year, the venue for the game shifted to Oriole Park at Camden Yards when it opened in 1992. In 2004, when the game lost the sponsorship of Crown, Brooks Robinson, as he had done so many times for the Orioles with a sparkling defensive play at third, saved the game. He sought out Joe Geier, a longtime friend, baseball fan, and Mount St. Joseph graduate, and the Geier Financial Group agreed to sponsor the game. Fittingly, the game was renamed the Brooks Robinson Senior High School All-Star Game. From 2021-23, MAI Capital Management sponsored the game, and now, ZIPS Cleaners has assumed sponsorship.



The game is usually played on a Sunday after an Orioles' game following the conclusion of State tournament play in late May. Today, team selection is a two-stage process. First, players try out for one of four region teams (North, South, East, and West). Those selected then play for their region in one of two games of the MSABC Classic. The top fifteen players from the North vs. West game are named to the North team, and the top fifteen players from the South vs. East game are named to the South team. Teams usually are comprised of four pitchers, two catchers, five infielders, and four outfielders. Alternates are also selected to be available if necessary. Coaches are selected by the game chairman. In the week prior to the game, a press conference is held at Camden Yards to introduce the players. The game itself is seven innings regardless of the score, with free substitution, and all of the position players in the batting order. Although not batting, each of the pitchers will have an opportunity to pitch. Following the game, a Most Outstanding Pitcher and a Most Valuable Player are selected for both the North and South teams. The North leads the series 21-18-3 with one game, 2006, washed out by rain after two innings. Due to the global pandemic, there was no game in 2020.

Memorial Stadium did its job of turning high school all-stars into star-gazers during yesterday's inaugural Crown North-South baseball game. The North squad won the contest, 6 to 4. But the outcome was irrelevant for the 30 recent high school graduates who played their game before last night's Orioles-Detroit contest. It was their one chance of living a major league fantasy, and they were properly awed at trodding in the footsteps of Palmer, Singleton, Murray and company. "When we walked in here for a practice Thursday night, everyone was screaming and going wild," said Craig Fitchett, the McDonogh graduate who tripled home a run, scored 2 others and made a spectacular catch for the North squad to earn the game's most valuable player award. "I've been waiting for a long time to play in this place." The teenagers could take a peek over their shoulders and watch some of the major leaguers watching the game. Detroit manager Sparky Anderson was among the first 300 spectators who showed up for the first pitch. He was later joined by several Oriole and Tiger players, who worked out on the warning track while the game proceeded. Fitchett, a muscular 6-foot-2, 190-pounder, even impressed Detroit Tiger catcher Lance Parrish. "Look at the arms on that guy," said Parrish, 6-3 and 210, to a teammate. "This was one of the most unbelievable things to be a part of." said Mike McMillan, the McDonogh coach who piloted the North squad. "Every one of the kids enjoyed being in the game. We had 118 kids try out for the teams this season. I hope we have 200 next season." The content was highlighted by a few unusual occurrences. There were 12 stolen bases, including four by Brooklyn Park's Scott Rowe. Rowe led off the South's first inning, reaching first base on an error and stealing second and third before skipping home on a single by Arundel's Alan Gray. In the fifth inning, Rowe had a delayed steal of home. The North used some traditional and untraditional scoring rallies to build a 4-1 lead in the first two innings. Dulaney's Robb Lippy had a 2-run single in the first inning, but in the second, the North scored 2 runs on two passed balls, a wild pitch, two errors, three walks and no hits. The North received excellent pitching from Patterson's Joe Mirabile, Parkville's Bill Honeycutt, Elkton's Dave Willis and South Hagerstown's Scott Sweeney. The foursome limited the South to three hits. Honeycutt was named the game's most valuable pitcher after striking out three batters and allowing no hits in two innings. Mirabile, the starter, won the decision. Fitchett saved the game for the North in the bottom of the fifth, with an over-the-shoulder grab in right field to rob Bill Smith of Great Mills of an extra-base hit and a run batted in. In the sixth, Patterson's Bill Gensler tripled and Fitchett followed with a triple to boost the North lead to 5-2. Fitchett later scored the North's last run on a double play. Bernie Walter, the Arundel coach who put the game together and led the South squad, was ecstatic after the contest "If we had won, I'd be a little happier," he deadpanned. "No one is a loser. An estimated 1,500 fans turned out Saturday to watch the Second Annual Crown High School North-South All-Star Baseball Game at Memorial Stadium, a crowd considerably larger than last year's. For the second year in a row, the North won the game, this time by a score of 6-2. Last year, the North won 7-3. "I think we at least doubled the attendance from a year ago," said Brooks Robinson, a co-chairman of the event along with Arundel's Bernie Walter. "I thought it was a pretty good turnout and that's what is important to Crown, the sponsor. That tells Crown there is interest in the game." The game itself, however, was not a very good one, and was rather sloppily played. Four Anne Arundel county residents played for the South squad, but none were spectacular. Most Valuable Player: **Len Herd** (Northeast-AA)

Lenny Herd, *The Arundel Sun* Baseball Player of the Year from Northeast High, was named Most Valuable Player in the third annual Crown High School All-Star Baseball Game. The Eagle catcher led the South team of coach Dave Warner to a 1-0 victory over the North in a game played last week at Memorial Stadium before a contest between the Orioles and the Kansas City Royals. Herd got credit for the game's only RBI, with a fourth inning fielder's choice that scored Old Mill first baseman Randy Collett. Collett led off the bottom of the fourth with a base hit to left, took second on Patapsco pitcher Jerome Santivasci's wild pitch, and advanced to third and scored on grounders by Andover's John Hardy and Herd. In the first inning, Herd picked a North runner off first base, displaying his strong arm and extraordinary knack for catching enemy runners napping. During the high school season, Herd picked off 15 runners, a record for the metro area. For Warner, *The Arundel Sun* Baseball Coach of the Year, the victory was especially satisfying, the culmination of a fine season. Warner led his Chesapeake Cougars into the Class AA playoffs this spring with a club in the process of rebuilding. "And when I found out I was going to be coaching in the Crown game, I was thrilled," said Warner. "It was great to have all that talent at my disposal, and it proves how good baseball is all over the state." Eight Anne Arundel countians played in the game. Joining Here, Collett, and Hardy were Frank Martin (Arundel), Rob Durocher (Arundel), Rick Schelfe (Old Mill) and John Webb (Northeast). Paul Grossman of Sparrows Point in Baltimore county, was named the game's outstanding pitcher after tossing three scoreless innings for the North. Most Outstanding Pitcher: **Todd Emde** (Churchill) *Most Valuable Player:* **Tony Hicks** (Mount St. Joseph)

Tony Hicks, the game's most valuable player, tripled and scored the go-ahead run as the North defeated the South, 4-3, in the Crown high school all-star baseball game for Maryland seniors today at Memorial Stadium. Hicks, from Mount St. Joseph of Baltimore, led off the sixth inning with a 400-foot smash to center for a stand-up triple. He scored one out later when Dennis Wiseman's pitch escaped catcher Julio Aristy. Churchill's Todd Emde earned the most valuable pitcher award for pitching two no-hit innings for the South team. Emde recorded two strikeouts and a walk while facing seven batters. In the first, the South couldn't score despite loading the bases. Mike Rolses struck out DuVal's Bruce Ford before retiring the next two batters. The North took a 2-0 lead in the second. Rolses got an infield single and went to third on Hicks' single to right. Middletown's Dell Ahalt sacrificed one runner across and Duane Rhine's infield single sent Hicks home. The South made it 2-1 when Dave Denhardt walked with the bases loaded in the bottom of the inning. The South went ahead, 3-2, in the fourth on three consecutive singles by Gary Myers, Allen Jones and Scott Vail and Lou Holcomb's sacrifice fly. The North tied it when Wiseman walked Jim Koslowski and yielded a double to Milford Mill's Brian Jordan in the fifth. Six Anne Arundel County high school baseball players experienced a thrill of a lifetime last weekend when they played at Baltimore's Memorial Stadium in the annual Crown High School All Star Game. They weren't as pleased with the game result: Their team, the South, lost 9-3 to representatives of schools from the North. Still, it was a thrill. "I think my dad was probably more excited about me playing out here today than I was." said John T. Baldwin, an all-county third baseman from Old Mill High School. "The stadium infield is like a pool table." said Brian Jenkins, a Severna Park High School catcher. "Nothing like that in high school." Maryland's top players participated in last Sunday's Crown event before a handful of major league scouts and several college coaches. Anne Arundel's contingent, however, was already spoken for by various colleges. Five of the six Anne Arundel players in the game had already accepted athletic scholarships from schools. The sixth was still pondering a couple of offers as of last week. Baldwin accepted a scholarship to Indian River Junior College in Florida. Arundel High School's outstanding duo of pitcher-first baseman Denny Neagle and shortstop pitcher Bryan Beauchemin have accepted baseball scholarships to the University of Minnesota and the University of Maryland, respectively. Severna Park's Jenkins, who earned all-county honors as an outfielder, accepted a full scholarship to the University of Maryland Baltimore County. And Steve Day, an outstanding pitcher-outfielder from Brooklyn Park High School, garnered a scholarship to Essex Community College after Anne Arundel Community College showed little interest. Darryl Handy, an all-county outfielder from Arundel High School played as an alternate in the Crown event when Terrence Carr of Salisbury was scratched from the line up after being drafted and signed by the California Angels last month. After leading county baseball in hitting last spring with a .500 batting average, Handy is trying to choose among three schools: Bowie State College, Community College of Baltimore and Essex Community College. In the Crown game, Neagle was the lone local player to knock in a run. He scored former teammate Beauchemin with a first inning fielder's choice. Beauchemin reached base as the only Anne Arundel representative to get a hit to the game. Beauchemin's single also knocked in a run. Not only did the high school all-stars get to play in a big league stadium, they also got to rub elbows with Oriole Hall of Famer Brooks Robinson, who serves as honorary chairman of the game, and several current Orioles such as Rick Dempsey and Terry Crowley, who hung around the dugouts following their game against Boston. BALTIMORE - For the sixth straight year, the Crown High School All-Star baseball game served as the last hurrah and an unofficial ending to the prep careers of 30 of Maryland's best baseball players. The game provided the all-stars with a chance to showcase their talents and gave them a chance to play on a major-league diamond at Baltimore's Memorial Stadium. Five Anne Arundel County players participated yesterday, with the South beating the North 5-0 in a game that followed the Baltimore Orioles' 8-4 win over the Toronto Blue Jays. Lamonte Boston of South River, Kyle Coffman and Steve Keppler of Arundel and Don Gilbert of Northeast played for the South. Mount St. Joseph's Dave Tripp, a Glen Burnie resident, played for the North. The five were selected from a list of 140 players from private and public schools in Maryland. They tried out at two camps, according to Arundel Coach Bernie Walter, who served as chairman for the game "This is the best way I know to end a high school career other than winning a state championship," said Gilbert, who started at first base and then moved to his normal position at short during the final two innings of the game. "It's just an honor being here and being able to play with the best high school players in the state. "It's always been a dream of mine to play here," added Gilbert, who is weighing college offers from Clemson University, Winthrop College and the University of Maryland-Baltimore County. "I never thought I'd get a chance (to play at Memorial Stadium) this early. There were a lot of players that tried out for this game — the best in the state. It's just a shock for me to be one of the ones to be selected to play in the game." Gilbert, who said he wanted to concentrate on his education before thinking of professional baseball, set a county record for hits in his career at Northeast and batted .536 in his senior year. Gilbert grounded out in his first two plate appearances for the South before scoring the winning run in the sixth. For five innings the stars took the phrase "there are no winners or losers in all-star games" literally, playing to a scoreless tie. But Gilbert started a game-winning rally in the sixth with a lead-off single to right. Arundel's Coffman and Keppler both played on a state championship team and then finished their high school careers in the Crown game. "This is exciting," said Keppler, a catcher bound for Drexel University on a soccer scholarship. "It's a once in a lifetime chance. It's a great way to end a season after winning a state championship." Keppler, who hit .449 for Arundel with 26 RBIs, grounded out in his first two appearances before singling with two out in the sixth. His Wildcat teammate Coffman pitched two innings of two-hit, shutout ball. Coffman, who will attend Trinidad Junior College in Colorado, worked out of a tough jam in the third inning after coming on in relief. An infield single and an error put runners on first and second in the inning with no one out, but Coffman got a fly out, strikeout and ground out to escape without a run. Boston, a three-time All-ABC League selection in the county, played a flawless center field, making a nice running catch in the third. Boston, who hit .425 during his prep career, reached on an error and struck out twice in three at-bats. Tripp hit .594 with six homers and 38 RBIs while leading St. Joe to the MSA A Conference champion. The North scored its first run in the bottom of the third when Scott Timmerman (Mount St. Joseph), named the North's MVP, scored from third on a double by Rich Hawkins (Boonsboro). Chapman's homer gave the South an 11-1 lead before Jeremy Long (Walkersville) drove in Jeff Kreaflle (Loch Raven) with a sacrifice fly in the seventh to close the scoring. South coach Ed Glaeser (Thomas Stone) had praise for Hynson, who took the loss for the North. "I've seen him a lot in American Legion ball and he's a good pitcher. His fastball was just flat. He just had a bad day," Glaeser said. Mike Hampton (North Hagerstown) pitched two scoreless innings and was named the North's Most Valuable Pitcher. But Neuberger's throw was a touch wide and West couldn't apply the tag on O'Patterson in time, giving the North a 7-6, come-from-behind victory. "I think it was a pretty exciting ballgame," said Bernie Walter of Arundel, one of three South team coaches. "Both teams played hard, it came down to the bottom of the seventh inning and he's out if he tags him." "I think the important thing is having the opportunity to play in Camden Yards with the best high school players in the state." The game was certainly fun. Even if most of the sellout crowd left immediately after the Orioles defeated the Twins, the high school stars found the experience exciting. "The feeling you just get when you first walk out there, you can't really talk," said John Poss, an All-Met from DeMatha. "It's incredible. You just feel kind of special." Both 15-player squads took practice at the same time as the Twins. Before the Orioles game, each Crown all-star was introduced to the crowd and his face was flashed on the JumboTRON screen in center field. Orioles Mike Devereaux and Harold Baines presented the players with bats on which the name of each participant was engraved. "Other than the state championship, this is probably the biggest baseball thrill of my life," said Paint Branch three-time All-Met pitcher Ryan Lambert. All-Met catcher Chris Junghans of McDonough hit a three-run double for the South, giving them a 3-2 lead in the third inning. Mike Cozzone of Arundel hit a sixth-inning home run for the South. "Walking out there and seeing all the fans in the stands and the Orioles in the dugout I'll never forget that." Old Mill shortstop Charlie Killmayer will remember patrolling the same territory as future Hall of Fame Cal Ripken. "You get out on that field, look around and take it all in. There's been a lot of great players out there. It's a great feeling to be in their place for one day" Killmayer said. Kurt Light will remember standing atop a major league pitching mound for the first time. The Crown High School All Star Game is about memories and being recognized as one of the top 30 senior baseball player in the state of Maryland. Performances are secondary. That's good because the six Anne Arundel County players who participated in yesterday's 16th annual edition didn't do much. Old Mill center fielder Danny Miller, Arundel right fielder Brian Lane and Chesapeake first baseman Jared Vogt joined D'Archangelo, Killmayer and Light on the South squad, which lost 4-2 to the North. The five position players all started and combined to go 0-for-9 with four walks at the plate. Miller went 0-for-3 with a strikeout, while Lane and Killmayer both went 0-for-2 with a walk. D'Archangelo was 0-for-1 with two walks and Vogt 0-for-1 with one walk. Lane was picked off first base, while D'Archangelo was thrown out at the plate trying to score from second on a single. Light was the losing pitcher, giving up four runs on three hits and four walks and a wild pitch in two innings. He had two strikeouts. "The walks are what hurt me I just wasn't hitting my spots today," said Light who has a full scholarship to Georgia "This is a great atmosphere, a great game I just wish I'd thrown better." Light loaded the bases with back to back walks with none out in the fifth. He then gave up a sacrifice fly by Chris Vinar (Thomas Johnson) and uncorked a wild pitch that enabled the North to take a 2-1 lead. Light walked two of the initial three batters in the sixth and again paid for it. Adam McKenzie (Loyola) delivered an RBI single and Pat Sherald (Catoctin) followed with a double off the left field wall. "I thought it was going to go out. I really wanted to be able to say I hit a homer out of Camden Yards," said Sherald, a catcher who was named the game's Most Valuable Player. Highlight of the day for the Anne Arundel County contingent came in the second inning when four of the five position players showed solid fundamentals in combining for an out. Lane fielded a single by Brett Holmes (Calvert Hall) and threw a strike to Killmayer covering second. Killmayer saw that Holmes had rounded first base too far and gunned a throw to Vogt. Vogt had Holmes hung up, so he ran at him toward second, and then threw to D'Archangelo, who had moved into position to make the tag. "I think everyone was a little nervous at first. It takes a couple of innings to settle in," said D'Archangelo, who made several nifty pick-ups at second. D'Archangelo, who plays for Severna Park Post 175 in the summer, skipped an American Legion Tournament to play in the Crown game. "Coach (Jim) McCandless knew this was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for me," D'Archangelo said. Killmayer was disappointed in the results, but said nothing could spoil being a statewide all star and playing at Camden Yards was "This is a great honor We all had to have good seasons to be here. For many who took the field for yesterday's Crown High School All-Star Game at Oriole Park at Camden Yards, the annual matchup of the state's top seniors had little to do with competitive baseball. It had more to do with grass -- thick, green, nearly flawless grass. Far better manicured than any the 30 participants had ever played on during their high school years, and mere minutes removed from serving as center stage for heroes like Cal Ripken and Greg Maddux, it was a vivid reminder of where they were and where they eventually want to be. In that respect, the North's 11-8 win over the South was virtually meaningless. To most, the chance to live out a dream was what the day was all about. "It was unbelievable," said McDonogh pitcher Bradd Caplan, who started for the North and allowed a run in two innings. "I've been here so many years watching Orioles games, but when I first stepped on the mound the dirt didn't move anywhere. It was great." The day began with player introductions over the stadium public address system prior to the Orioles' game against the Atlanta Braves. Each player was then presented with a souvenir bat, his name engraved on the sweet spot. Getting to actually play a game was the icing on the cake. South catcher Keith Brunst of Severna Park knew with one swing of the bat that this day was special. "That first single I got... the sound that it made -- the echo -- it was unbelievable," said Brunst, who went 2-for-3. "I'm sure it was only from the aluminum, but it was awesome." For Calvert Hall infielder Michael Wineke, who went 3-for-4 to earn North MVP honors, the game was a chance to fulfill a family dream. His father, Larry, had been scheduled to appear in a Crown All-Star game in the '70s before rain canceled the event. Wineke, as well as Calvert Hall teammate Greg DeBoy (two-run double) and Catoctin's John West (RBI double) helped the North score nine runs in the second inning to build their lead to 11-1. The South rallied late, scoring three on a bases-loaded double by Westlake's Daryl Whitmer and another on a run-scoring single by Arundel's Hector Guadalupe to make it 11-8. (Scherr, Rich. Banks was a 34th round draft pick of the Baltimore Orioles in last week's amateur baseball draft, but has not decided on his plans for next season. "I'm waiting to see if the Orioles make me an offer," he said. "If they do, we will see what kind of offer it is and go from there. This is a great place to play. I could get used to this." Banks could also play college baseball at Florida International University in Miami. Banks got some help in the field from Severna Park teammate and county athlete of the year Derek Dixon, who made the catch of the day in right. Dixon robbed Glen Burnie resident and Mount St. Joseph star Allen Strick of extra bases when he went deep into the right field corner and leaped against the wall to make an inning-ending catch. "The ball was hit hard down the line," said Dixon "It was tailing away from me, but if the ball is hit in the air anywhere near me I always figure that I can catch it." Dixon will continue his baseball career next season at the University of North Carolina-Charlotte. Ryan Bellerby (Broadneck) entered the game to pitch the fifth and sixth. After a rough fifth, in which he gave up two runs on three hits, Bellerby settled down to retire the North in order in the sixth, striking out two. "These are the best hitters in the state, so you have to make good pitches," said Bellerby. "In the fifth I let a couple get away from me and they hit them. In the sixth I cleared my mind, made some adjustments, settled down a bit, and just tried to stay within myself." Bellerby will attend the University of Tennessee next year. Richard Guarnera (North County) went 1-for-2 with a walk and a double. He was robbed in his first at-bat on a nice catch by the shortstop. "I was just trying to hit the ball hard out there," said Guarnera. "This was a fantastic experience, something I will remember for the rest of my life." Jason Galloway (Old Mill) also played, going 0-for-3. But he hit the ball hard in all three at-bats. "I was here to have fun and it was a great time," said Galloway. "Playing at Camden Yards is a great way to end my high school career." Galloway will attend Towson University next year on a football scholarship. Strick went 2-for-3 with a single, a double and an RBI. He was also hit by a pitch. The offensive MVP for the South was Brian McKenna of Watkins Mill, who went 2-for-3 with two doubles and two RBIs. Hammond pitcher Kevin Schwartz stood on the field at Camden Yards and looked around him -- at the carefully tended grass, the rising rows of seats and the center field JumboTron, where his picture and those of the other Crown All-Stars appeared before a recent Orioles game. "My mind just went blank," Schwartz said of the experience. "I'm playing in a major league park. This is something you imagine doing when you are a kid and playing baseball with your friends in the back yard. Now I'm actually here, not as a fan, but as a player." Schwartz, a right-handed pitcher, was among 30 just-graduated Maryland seniors selected to play in the prestigious Crown All-Star Game, which showcases some of the best high school baseball talent in the state. For most of them, it was their first and last chance to play on a major league field, an experience of a lifetime. Along with Schwartz, Hammond two-time All-Met catcher Jason Maxey and Glenelg outfielder Chris Bowen were the Howard County athletes who enjoyed a brief taste of the major leagues, if only before just 200 family members and friends who stayed after the June 10 Orioles game to watch the all-stars. "The adrenaline rush right now makes me feel like I just ran a quarter-mile," said Schwartz's father, Bob, who made his way to the front row behind home plate after the Orioles game was over. "Jason and Kevin are like brothers, and now I'm watching them play catch at Camden Yards. It is the perfect way to end their high school careers." Though their South team lost to the North, 4-1, it was the experience, not the score, that counted on this sunny afternoon. The All-Stars enjoyed a few major league amenities. They used the auxiliary locker room near where the Orioles dress, and took advantage of a buffet of submarine sandwiches, potato chips and chocolate chip cookies. During the game, they sat on the padded dugout bench the Orioles use, and used the dugout phone to call their teammates in the Orioles' bullpen behind the center field fence. "What more can you ask for? Can it really get better than this?" said Schwartz, who went 17-0 his last two years, including an 8-0 mark this past season. "I have spent my whole life playing baseball, and have watched the Orioles play all the time. It's going to be hard, but I'm going to try to remember everything about this day -- it was one of the best days of my life." Schwartz, who will play at the University of South Carolina at Spartansburg in the fall, pitched the seventh inning and gave up a run on two hits and had one strikeout. Maxey, who will play at Maryland in the fall, was 0 for 3, but hit the ball sharply off Mount St. Joseph starter Gavin Floyd, the North team's starter who was the fourth pick in the recent major league draft. Bowen, who also has signed to play at Maryland, was 2 for 3 with a triple, and was named the South's most valuable player. "That triple was definitely sweet," Bowen said. "It was a 3-0 count, but there was no way I was not going to swing and get walked - - it's an all-star game. I hit it pretty far, and for a second I thought it was gone. It would have been a home run at any other park I had played in this year, but not here, not at Camden Yards. It's been a great year, and high school has been a great time of my life, and now it's over. I'm ready to move on with the rest of my life." So are Maxey and Schwartz, Bowen's summer league teammates on the Columbia Reds. But before heading home, the two Golden Bears took one last jog around the field, knowing the chances of returning to Camden Yards as major leaguers are not in their favor. So they did the next best thing. They swiped some of that finely manicured outfield grass and shoved it into their back pockets, then disappeared into the crowd. (Gallo, Jon. Through 3 1/2 innings, the 22nd Crown High School All-Star Game looked like a pitchers' duel. The first half of the seven-inning game, which split 30 of the top senior players around the state into North and South teams, featured 10 strikeouts and just three hits. But in the bottom of the fourth, Broadneck's Preston Pehrson capped a two-out rally with a three-run homer, leading the South to a 5-1 victory in front of several hundred spectators at Oriole Park after yesterday's Orioles game. The South scored four of its runs in the fourth. With the North up 1-0 and two outs, Riverdale Baptist's Micah Terrill started the comeback with a double to right. Severna Park's Alex Vitale, The Sun Player of the Year, singled in Terrill, and Old Mill's Bernie Harvey doubled to put runners at second and third. Pehrson then drove a pitch from Brunswick's Brian Baugher just over the 373-foot sign in right-center. "It was a fastball, and I just saw it perfect and got a hold of it," said Pehrson, who was named the game's Most Valuable Player. "It's just great to play here, though. It'd be nice if I can get paid to play one day." Pehrson, a 6-foot-2, 235-pound catcher who was an All-Metro second-team selection, hit .476 while driving in 24 runs for Broadneck and will attend Jacksonville University next fall, where he hopes to work toward returning to Camden Yards one day. "Hopefully, I can make the big leagues, but it'll take me a lot of work to get there," Pehrson said. "I hope it's not the last time I get to play up here." River Hill pitcher Michael Anton struck out two and threw two hitless innings to pick up the win, and Arundel's Joe Frykman pitched a perfect seventh to get the save. The staff of Anton, Frykman, Watkins Mill's Matt Montgomery and Kent Island's Bryan Brainer allowed one unearned run and struck out 10. The Crown All-Star Game is considered the most prestigious exhibition of high school baseball talent in the state. The rosters included two players taken in the amateur draft, Montgomery and Old Mill's Tyler Young. Young, who singled in three at-bats, was drafted by the Orioles in the 46th round. The fleet All-Metro center fielder, who hit .467 in leading the Patriots to a state championship this spring, said he has dreamed of playing for the Orioles since he was a youngster. "It's the only uniform I could imagine getting myself into," said Young, who will attend Shoals (Ala.) Community College next year. But Young considers making the All-Star team as his crowning achievement. "Just being here, it's an achievement you've wanted since your freshman year," he said. "Because the best high school all-star game is Crown. Even before the game you get butterflies like when you first play baseball. Just being here, it's a good time." For others, the game had an even deeper meaning. "It's a thrill," said Riverdale Baptist coach Terry Terrill, who coached his son Micah for the South squad. "I told him he had to get a hit for me before the game because it was Father's Day, so it makes it a little extra special. When Chad Durakis legged out an infield hit, stole second and later scored on a wild pitch in the top of the fourth inning, he seemingly had given his team the spark it needed. But Durakis' run would be the only scored by the North team yesterday at Camden Yards, as the South squad rode seven innings of near-flawless pitching for a 5-1 win in the Brooks Robinson High School All-Star Game. "We have a lot of good hitters on the team, but the pitching on their team ..." said Durakis, a two-time All-Metro catcher from St. Paul's who has a baseball scholarship from the University of Maryland. "They were just a great staff that we went against, so there's no shame in our performance." And it won't be the loss Durakis, the MVP of the North team, remembers most about the afternoon. The players were introduced to the crowd of 45,728 before the Orioles game. Both all-star teams lined up on the first base line and each player was presented with a commemorative bat and greeted by the Orioles' Jerry Hairston. "It was pretty sweet," said DeMatha's Robbie Campbell, who pitched two perfect innings for the South to start the game, formerly sponsored by Crown Petroleum. "When you look up and see all those people ... it's ridiculous." Campbell, one of four pitchers the South used to combine on a three-hitter, was named the Most Valuable Pitcher. "It's not every day you get to pitch at Camden Yards," said Campbell, who will play for East Tennessee State. "I was just going to throw strikes and do as well as I could do and let the defense play behind me." Durakis' hit in the fourth was the first for the North, which stranded runners on second and third that inning against pitcher Brad Taylor (Good Counsel). South pitchers Jeff Feigl (Arundel) and Tyler Todd (Cambridge) combined for three scoreless innings the rest of the way. Arundel's Brian McCormick led the South offensively, scoring two runs and driving in another on a sacrifice fly. He will play for St. Petersburg. "My dream is to play on that field," McCormick said of Camden Yards. "Honestly, I was just glad to get on base, really. Getting a hit and scoring two runs, that just made it even better." The South scored two runs in the second inning, one in the fourth and two in the sixth. Its MVP was Joe Zimmerman (Arundel) with two hits. T.J. For Neal Davis, tossing two scoreless innings yesterday at Camden Yards was like a test drive - a couple quick trips around the block that might help him make one of the biggest decisions of his life later this summer. The Orioles drafted Davis in the 39th round earlier this month, and the Catonsville High left-hander will weigh that option against joining the University of Virginia in the fall. But with the dust hardly settled from the Orioles' game against the Washington Nationals yesterday afternoon, Davis took the major league mound for the North team in the 25th annual Brooks Robinson All-Star High School Game of Maryland. He tossed a quick 1-2-3 first inning and stranded a runner after allowing a single in the second, but remains tight-lipped about where he thinks he'll be playing next season. "I'm keeping my options open right now, seeing if the Orioles make me a good enough offer at the end of the summer," the 6-foot-5, 195-pound Davis said. "And if not, I get to go down to Virginia and play for a great conference and a great school." This summer Davis is pitching for Youse's Maryland Orioles in the Cal Ripken Sr. Collegiate Baseball League, under the coaching of Orioles scout Dean Albany. There, he faces some talented hitters, but nothing comparable with climbing atop the big league rubber. "Going out there after all the major leaguers, I was pretty pumped," Davis said. The umpires called the All-Star game because of rain after Davis struck out Huntingtown's Ian Schwalenberg to end the second. The North was leading 3-0 thanks to a first-inning three-run home run from Robbie Mathias - a play the Liberty infielder called "a dream." Surely the showcase, albeit brief, fulfilled the fantasies of several of the best seniors in the state, but for Davis it may be a case of foreshadowing. "I couldn't imagine being in front of 30,000 people," Davis admitted on his way out of the Camden Yards concourse. "But, I've got to see if I perform well enough. Maybe I'll be here in a few years." Here they were, 30 of Maryland's finest, tracing the white chalk at Oriole Park before the start of the Orioles' game against the Colorado Rockies yesterday. That's why the young men who participated in the Brooks Robinson All-Star High School Game didn't mind the 11-man lineups, didn't mind waiting for foul balls to be tossed back onto the field so play could resume, didn't mind starting a game and knowing that someone on the bench would finish it. And as the sun fell on the park, the South held on to beat the North, 5-4, in seven innings. Quince Orchard's Kyle Judson was the game's Most Valuable Player, going 2-for-3 for the South and stealing two bases. Chris Moore of Chesapeake-Anne Arundel took home honors as the South's best pitcher. "It's a thrill of a lifetime for some of these kids," said Arundel's Bernie Walter, one of three South coaches. "Most of these kids will probably never get on this field again. This gives them the opportunity to come out here and play in something special." The South took a 4-0 lead in the first inning, led by RBI singles from Huntingtown's Matthew Baden and Parkside's Brian Green. The South never trailed, but Centennial's Austin Harclerode of the North made it interesting in the seventh when he hit the game's only home run, a bases-empty shot, to left, bringing his team within one. "That was definitely one of the most exciting things I've ever done, especially playing here," Harclerode said. "I'll remember it for the rest of my life." Despite facing perhaps the toughest lineup of his life while toeing the rubber at Oriole Park at Camden Yards Sunday afternoon, former Gaithersburg High pitcher Kevin Brady said his only plan of attack was to “just come out and do what I normally do.” Considering Brady has been perhaps the state’s most dominant pitcher the past two seasons, that approach was a sound one and, once again, it worked to perfection as the flame-throwing right-handed hurler struck out four and started an inning-ending double play in his two innings of work to help propel his South all-star squad to a 10-5 victory over the North squad at the Brooks Robinson High School All-Star Game, a contest that features the best senior baseball players in the state. Brady, the South team’s starting pitcher, struck out the first batter he faced, Westminster’s Phil Ruzbarsky, and after allowing two runners to reach on a walk and an infield base hit, he fanned the next two batters to end the inning. The Clemson University-bound Brady, who was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 44th round of the 2008 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, started the second inning with a strikeout of C. Milton Wright’s Jordan Wloldarczyk, allowed a single to Boys’ Latin’s Austin Knight and then turned a groundball up the middle into a 1-6-3 double play. “Knowing I just got drafted by the Orioles, it makes me look on it a little different,” said Brady, who was named the South team’s Most Outstanding Pitcher for his performance. “I could be pitching here. Whether I sign at the end of the summer or in three years [if drafted by Baltimore again], it brought a whole different meaning.” The two innings served as a final tune-up for this week’s 32nd Annual Sunbelt Classic, an annual tournament pitting all-star teams from different states and Canada in Oklahoma. Brady (7-0, two saves, 98 strikeouts in 2008) pitched for Team Maryland last summer as well, earning a win and a save. “I was a little nervous [Sunday] but once I got the mound the way I wanted it, I was able to settle down and throw all of my pitches,” said Brady, the two-time Gazette Player of the Year. “Three years ago, I didn’t think this would happen. It’s a reality now.” Joining Brady in Oklahoma will be recent Sherwood High graduate Tom Gilchrist, who played for the South squad Sunday in the Brooks Robinson game, as did Damascus High graduate Shane Boyd. Gilchrist, an outfielder, went 1 for 3 and scored a run in his three at-bats. Both the hit and the run came in the decisive sixth inning as the South turned a 6-5 lead into the commanding four-run victory. “It was a thrill of a lifetime,” Gilchrist said. “I’m glad I got to do it.” Boyd, a first-team All-Gazette performer like Gilchrist, also expressed enjoyment in his experience at Camden Yards, which hosted a 10-inning affair between the Pittsburgh Pirates and Orioles earlier in the day, but he was unable to fulfill one of his goals. “I wanted to get a hit and play well overall to showcase my talent,” said Boyd, who went hitless in three at-bats. “[The pitchers] were good. They’re the best pitchers in the state. BALTIMORE — Three Frederick County baseball standouts were able to savor memorable moments at Sunday's Brooks Robinson All-Star Classic baseball game at Baltimore's Oriole Park at Camden Yards, where their North All-Stars team fell to the South, 16-3. Urbana High's Dylan Driscoll was one of four pitchers selected for the North team, and his efforts on the mound earned him North Pitcher of the Game honors. Richard Cruz-Sanchez, also from Urbana, made the team as an outfielder. His standout play was a fly ball turned into a double play when he gunned down a runner at first base in the first inning. Linganore's Jay Knight Jr., rotated between shortstop and second base for the North team. Frederick High assistant coach Phil Rhodes was chosen as an assistant coach for the North. Cruz-Sanchez had the first chance to make an impact in the game when the South's Alex Ramsey (Severna Park) led off with a shot to deep right field. Sunlight was beaming through the upper deck seats and into Cruz-Sanchez's face, and he missed the catch, allowing a triple. "It was so hard to read the ball," Cruz-Sanchez said. "It just got lost." Four batters later, he got a chance to redeem himself, fielding a pop-out, and then firing back to first for a double play. Cruz-Sanchez also was the third North player to get on base, taking a walk in his first at-bat. He made it over to third on a fielders' choice from Knight. Knight then stole second, but both Frederick County players were stranded in scoring position when Gaithersburg's Nick Riley struck out Mount Hebron's Brody Tennant for the third out. Driscoll, both an excellent hitter and pitcher, could only pitch or play in the field at Sunday's game. "It would have been nice to hit here," Driscoll said. "But against this caliber of players, I'm more comfortable as a pitcher." So he participated in the standard two innings, starting in the third, when he walked one batter without giving up a base hit on 10 total pitches. The bottom of the fourth was less kind to Driscoll, who gave up a walk and a single. Both runners scored because of two North errors. Driscoll would go on to give up three more hits and strike out a batter while holding North's opportunistic rally to only one more run. Driscoll and his teammates got to the park early, taking part in an opening ceremony at the Baltimore-New York Mets contest, where each All-Star was given a commemorative bat. Driscoll heard about the All-Star game last year when he was looking up information on the elite high-school age summer squad Team Maryland. Then, he didn't expect to be able to make the roster. "I didn't have my greatest year statistically," Driscoll said. "It seems like a dream, to be playing in a state All-Star game in Camden Yards." But at some point, the senior started to realize the reality. "Towards the end of the year, when you start looking at the stats, and I'm getting the breaks and getting eight wins and no losses, I started to realize this could happen," Driscoll said. "I realized that some of the postseason awards were possible." Cruz-Sanchez made it a season-ending goal for him to play in Camden Yards. "I was hoping for it," Cruz-Sanchez said. "I was hoping to be good at pitching this year, and my hitting just came out of nowhere." But for Knight, the game was an honor as much as it was a surprise. "It just kind of happened," Knight said. Hockaday, who starred at John Carroll and was the Orioles' 14th-round draft pick last week, was scheduled to play but sat out with a sprained ankle. He said the injury, which he suffered while rounding first in a game, is "not that bad" and should sideline him three to five weeks. Hockaday wasn't worried about missing his first chance to play at the stadium he could someday call home. "That day will come," Hockaday said. As Tom Hanks' character famously says in "A League of Their Own," there is no crying in baseball. But there is, apparently, tying in baseball. At least there was Tuesday afternoon in the 32nd annual Brooks Robinson All-Star Game at Camden Yards. The North and South teams, each composed of 15 of the state's top high school seniors, played to a 3-3 tie in the showcase game. The game was rescheduled for Tuesday after being stopped in the third inning Sunday evening because of thunderstorms. There were no losers Tuesday afternoon, but there were winners. "You can't beat coming out here in your own home state's ballpark like this," North pitcher Bruce Zimmerman (Loyola) said. "This is one of the best experiences, and I'll never forget it." Zimmerman's sentiment was echoed by his fellow All-Stars. "It's a dream come true," South infielder Joe Zayatz (Oakland Mills) said. "Every little kid wants to play on a major league diamond." Zayatz is a New York Yankees fan but has been to Camden Yards many times and always has aspired to take the field. He felt overwhelmed by the situation when he first stepped to the on-deck circle, but the nerves quickly dissipated. "It's just baseball," Zayatz said. The "wow" factor was temporary, but the adjustments these players, accustomed to smaller fields, had to make were real. Angles taken to balls were different because of the depth of the field, and batters' eyes were greeted with more center-field signage than they were used to seeing. Batters adjusted quickly to the major league setting. The North team took a 1-0 lead in its first at-bat as Brady Policelli tripled and later scored on an error by the South shortstop. The North appeared set up for a big inning with the bases loaded and one out, but Ron Farley (Calvert Hall) grounded into an inning-ending double play. The South countered with two runs in the bottom of the first when a base hit up the middle by Carl Colbert drove in a pair. The North tied the game at 2 in the fourth when Farley atoned for the earlier double play by knocking a two-out pitch down the right-field line for an RBI. The North took a 3-2 lead the next inning when Matthew Tilley (Gilman) scored on a wild pitch. The South evened the score a half-inning later, though, on a wild pitch by Seth Schubert. Tuesday's tie was the third such result in the game's history. It also served as an awkward conclusion to a 35-year career for South coach Ken Dunn (South River), who was in a dugout for the final time. "They say [tying] is like kissing your sister, but that's OK -- my sister's good-looking," Dunn said. While the result was unexpected, Dunn felt privileged to be asked to participate. With last year's game cancelled due to the global pandemic, it was great to have Maryland's best high school senior baseball players back in action at Oriole Park at Camden Yards on June 27, 2021 in the 39th playing of the annual Brooks Robinson High School Senior All-Star Game. Prior to the game, Orioles Hall of Famer and the game's namesake, Brooks Robinson, provided a video message on the Jumbotron congratulating the players on their selection to the game. At the end, he said he had a feeling that someone would "go deep". Brooks intuition was proven correct when Jackson Merrill of Severna Park, the South's Most Valuable Player, hit a 2-out, 2-run homer in the 7th inning to tie the game. After the South's Most Outstanding Pitcher, Brandon Brown of Atholton shut down the North in the home half of the inning with two strikeouts, the game ended in a tie for the third time in the game's history since extra innings are not played. The visiting South team started the game quickly with three runs in the first inning behind RBI singles by Andrew Leginze of La Plata and Shawn Cameron of Chopticon. The North would answer with two runs in the bottom of the first without benefit of a hit, and then take a 4-3 lead in the bottom of the second with another two runs without a hit. A 2-out, 2-run triple to deep right field by Thomas Joseph of Archbishop Spalding the following inning would put the South back ahead 5-4. Meanwhile, the South's Evan Selmer of Indian Creek would hold the North scoreless with three strikeouts over the next two innings despite an infield single by Dean Wandell of Walter Johnson and a lined single to center by Jack Van Valkenburgh of St. Paul's. In two innings of work, Brett Seils of Sherwood, the North's Most Outstanding Pitcher, notched three strikeouts while surrendering only an infield single to Jack Pistner of Centennial and a RBI groundout by John Welch of Reservoir. In the bottom of the sixth with the South ahead 6-4, the North would retake the lead with four unearned runs, all scoring after two outs. The North's 2-out rally started after Trevor Yusko of Thomas Johnson lined a single to left. After two walks and an error, Brendan Kleiman of Sherwood earned his second bases loaded RBI without putting the ball in play, when he walked. In the 2nd, his RBI was with a hit by pitch. With the bases still loaded, Casey Bishop, the North's Most Valuable Player, drove in two runs with a ground rule double to deep center, giving the North a two-run lead entering the final inning. Merrill's homer, the first in the game since 2016, would tie the game at 8. With the tie, the North leads the series, 19-16-3, with one game, 2006, washed out by rain after two innings.

In the 40th annual Brooks Robinson High School Senior All-Star Game at Oriole Park at Camden Yards on June 5, 2022, the North used their only two hits to score their only runs in the fourth inning, and held on to beat the South 3-1. Prior to the game, all players received baseballs signed by current Orioles pitcher Bruce Zimmerman, who was selected as the Most Outstanding Pitcher in the 2013 Brooks Robinson High School Senior All-Star Game. Zimmerman is one of 28 All-Star Game alumni who have played in the majors to date. Perhaps the signed baseball was inspiration for the pitchers, as pitching dominated in the game with 19 strikeouts between the two teams. The North's starter, Matt Archibald of John Carroll surrendered a lined single to left by Michael Martin of Southern in the first and in the next inning, a lead-off double to right by Broadneck's Nick Stergiou, but both runners were left stranded, as Archibald, who would be named the North's Most Outstanding Pitcher, struck out five of the other six batters he faced. Pitching the first two innings for the South, Nick Karls of Chesapeake-AA notched three strikeouts and only allowed a hit batter to reach base. He would be named the South's Most Outstanding Pitcher. After a lead-off walk in the top of the fourth, second baseman Brendan George of Baltimore Poly had the fielding play of the game with a diving stop of a ground ball and getting the force at second base. The South's Ben Davis of Reservoir then lined a double to left-center putting runners at second and third. A hit batter would load the bases with one out, but Beck Urofsky of Bethesda-Chevy Chase pitched out of the jam to finish his two scoreless innings of work with three strikeouts, and would eventually earn the win. With the game still scoreless and without a hit, the North went to work in the bottom of the fourth. After a groundout, Tariq Talley of Towson beat out a grounder to short and advanced to second on a wild pitch. He stole third after a walk to Kyle Sanger of Tuscarora who advanced on the throw. After a strikeout, Liam Houghton of Good Counsel would plate both runners with a 2-out ground double just fair down the third base line. After stealing third, Houghton would score the North's third run on a passed ball. He was named the North's Most Valuable Player. The North would have no other hits or runs, as the South's Sam Cohen of Mount Hebron, with two strikeouts in his two innings, and North Caroline's Kyle Speas with two strikeouts in the final inning, shut them down. Meanwhile, Brendan Yagesh of Urbana pitched two scoreless innings for the North with no hits and two strikeouts. In the top of the seventh, Ben Davis, named the South's Most Valuable Player, led off with his second hit of the game, and then stole second. After being advanced to third, he would score on a lined single to center by Chet Bowling of La Plata for the South's first run. A single to center by John Greenawalt would put the potential tying runners at first and second with one out. After a flyout for the second out, the South's hopes ended when pitcher Chase Supensky of Towson threw out a runner attempting to steal third, thereby earning the save. With the victory, the North now leads the series 20-16-3, with the 2006 game washed out by rain after two innings and the 2020 not played due to the global pandemic.

In the 41st annual Brooks Robinson High School Senior All-Star Game at Oriole Park at Camden Yards on June 25, 2023, the North opened the game with three runs and held on to beat the South 5-3. Sherwood's Brian Scott led off the game with an infield single, but would later be caught trying to steal third base by catcher Ethan McNally of Archbishop Spalding. A strikeout and two hit batters would then set the stage for Frank Adamski Jr. of John Carroll who got the North on the board first with a 2-out, 2-run triple to deep right center. On the next pitch, he was driven in on a single by Ryan Bouma of Sherwood to give the North a 3-0 lead. Frank Adamski Jr. would be named the North's Most Valuable Player. Although striking out the side in the bottom of the first, the North's starter, Keegan Johnson of Urbana surrendered an unearned run to allow the South to close to 3-1. Johnson, who would pitch a scoreless second inning with another strikeout, was named the North's Most Outstanding Pitcher. Leading off the top of the second, Zane Gross of Churchill hit a booming drive to left that short-hopped the wall. Up until last year, when the left field fence was significantly pushed back, it would have probably been a home run, but Gross had to settle for a double. He was driven in by a RBI grounder by Brian Scott to give the North a 4-1 lead. The South's Sean Murphy of Broadneck would keep the North scoreless the next two innings. In the bottom of the fourth, shortstop Ethan Ruiz of John Carroll, took away a hit from Kyle Lowman of North County with an incredible fielding play on a hard-hit grounder up the middle. However later in the inning, the South would finally get their first hit and second run when Adam Hicks of Gilman doubled down the right field line for a 2-out RBI. The North would lead off the sixth inning with back-to back singles by Amari Allen of Sherwood and Frank Adamski Jr. After a strikeout and a walk to load the bases, a single by Griffin Madden of Allegheny would give the North a 5-2 lead. An out later, a diving catch in right by the South's Adam Hicks would avert any further damage. Throwing 11 of his 15 pitches for strikes and notching two strikeouts in a scoreless seventh, while yielding only an infield single to Ethan Ruiz (his second of the game), Sam Howard of South River would be named the South's Most Outstanding Pitcher. Down to their final three outs, the South's Dylan Melton of Glenelg Country would start things off with a single to left, but would be erased on a fielder's choice grounder. After a walk and a strikeout, Kyle Lowman came to the plate representing the tying run. He delivered with a 2-out RBI single leaving runners at the corners. Lowman would be named the South's Most Valuable Player. However, Ben Berger of Sherwood then earned the save for the North by striking out the South's last hope. Liam Diehl of Hereford and Leo Simpson of Walter Johnson pitched scoreless innings for the North, while Aidan Harris of Hammond had a single for the South. With the victory, the North now leads the series 21-16-3, with the 2006 game washed out by rain after two innings and the 2020 game not played due to the global pandemic.

In the first game since the passing of Brooks Robinson last fall, former Baltimore Orioles great Al Bumbry stepped up for his former teammate in throwing the ceremonial first pitch at the 42nd annual Brooks Robinson High School Senior All-Star Game played at Oriole Park at Camden Yards on July 1, 2024. Mac Crismond of Sherwood started for the North and retired the side in order in his one inning of work. He would later be selected as the North's Most Outstanding Pitcher. In the bottom half of the first, Lukas Loring of Stephen Decatur would also throw a perfect inning thanks to a blast by Ryan Maxey of Georgetown Prep being caught in deep right. Despite back-to-back lead-off singles by Ryan Brown of Great Mills and Lucas Edwards of Mount Hebron, the South could not plate a run in the top of the second against Michael Hemelt of Patterson Mill. With help of a 6-3 double play started by Calvin Cook of Broadneck, Lukas Loring would pitch another hitless, scoreless inning in the home half, and would later be selected as the South's Most Outstanding Pitcher. The South would score the first run of the game in the top of the third when a Sacrifice Fly by Cade Ahearn of Centennial plated Danny Dorsey of Glenelg who had reached on a lined single to left. Further damage was avoided thanks to a leaping bases-loaded, 2-out snare by first baseman Hunter St Denis of Magruder of a line drive ticketed for extra bases hit by Lucas Edwards. Daniel Hesson of Colonel Richardson would then preserve the South's one run lead, overcoming lead-off singles by Ryan Thompson of St. Maria Goretti, Koltin Boyer of Brunswick, and a bases-loaded jam. After a lead-off single by Chase Kamerman of Marriott's Ridge and loading the bases, the South also couldn't score against Luke Pearre of Poolesville in the top of the fourth. In the home half, the North would take the lead behind singles by Pierce Tewksbury of Bethesda Chevy-Chase, Will Oates of St. Maria Goretti, and Jackson Inman of Good Counsel. With two runs in, further damage was averted by a sensational bases-loaded, 2-out diving catch in right by Danny Orr of Thomas Johnson. As often seems to be the case in baseball, a player making a great catch leads off the next inning, and Orr delivered with a lined single down the left field line. Two batters later, he would score on Ryan Brown's second hit of the game with another run scoring on an error. Lucas Edwards' second hit would set up runners at the corners with no outs, but a potential Sacrifice Fly resulted in Brown being gunned out at the plate by a strike from center fielder Koltin Boyer. Taking a 3-2 lead into the top of the sixth, the South would blow the game open with five runs on singles by Arundel's Tha'Mon McGriff, Danny Dorsey, and Danny Orr, and a booming line drive triple to deep center field by Cade Ahearn. Ryan Brown would plate the final run with a RBI grounder, and would later be selected as the South's Most Valuable Player for his two hits and 3 RBIs. In the bottom half, the North would get one run back after a leadoff single by Jackson Inman, making the score 8-3 heading into the final frame. Bobby Burk of Bethesda Chevy-Chase would then work around Chase Kamerman's second hit to pitch a scoreless inning. Hunter St Denis would lead off the bottom of the seventh with a single, and then score on a no-outs double by Pierce Tewksbury, who would later be selected as the North's Most Valuable Player. However, Tewksbury would be left stranded, giving the South the win, 8-4. Despite the South's triumph, the North still leads the series 21-17-3, with the 2006 game washed out by rain after two innings and the 2020 game not played due to the global pandemic.

In the 43rd annual Brooks Robinson High School Senior All-Star Game played at Oriole Park at Camden Yards on July 13, 2025, the South overcame a 5-run deficit and held on to beat the North 8-6. For the first three innings, the only hit for either team was a first inning single up the middle by Dawson Daniels of Washington. The visiting North team would score two runs in the second on two walks, three stolen bases, and two wild pitches to support Nolan Ross of Walter Johnson who started and pitched two scoreless innings with three strikeouts. He would later be selected as the North's Most Outstanding Pitcher. In the top of the third, the South's Chase Hannon of Broadneck would pitch a perfect inning with two strikeouts, and would be named the South's Most Outstanding Pitcher. In the home half, the South would score one run on hit batters, walks, and wild pitches. So heading into the top of the fourth, the North was hitless, but leading 2-1. Dallas Brooks of John Carroll quickly changed that with a lead-off homer to right, which was the first home run hit in the game since 2021 and only the second since 2016. After a hit batter, Ty Hames of Sherwood would stroke a RBI double down the left field line. Two batters later he would score when Charlie Buckles of Walt Whitman would also hit a home run to deep right field. Jack McNally of Archbishop Spalding would then single, but be left stranded. The North now had a seemingly commanding 6-1 lead, but the South would not let it last even through the next half inning. River Hill's Anderson Dang got the comeback going with a lead-off single. After a couple of walks, Noah Forman of Broadneck stroked a 2-run bases loaded single. A RBI groundout by Will Sherwood of St. Michaels would make the score 6-4. After two hit batters, the bases would be loaded with two outs for Mike Swick of Broadneck, who cleared them with a triple to right, giving the South the lead at 7-6. He would later be named the South's Most Valuable Player. In the top of the fifth, Dakota Patton of Northeast overcame singles by Josh Tseronis of Quince Orchard and Dallas Brooks to pitch a scoreless inning. For the North, Jason Seils of Sherwood and Owen Shaprow of Archbishop Curley would also pitch scoreless innings. In the sixth, Charlie Buckles, who would be selected as the North's Most Valuable Player, made a bid for a second home run with a deep drive caught on the warning track in center. Despite Josh Tseronis' second single in the seventh, the South's Matt Russell of Reservoir would finish the game with two scoreless innings to earn the Save. He would also become the first pitcher in two years to strike out the side. As seven complete innings are played regardless of the score, the, the South would score another run in the bottom of the seventh when Will Sherwood scored on an error after his lead-off single, making the final score 8-6. Although the South has now won the last two games, the North still leads the series 21-18-3, with the 2006 game washed out by rain after two innings and the 2020 game not played due to the global pandemic.

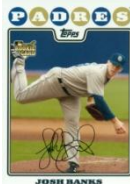

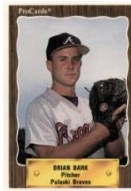
Josh Banks

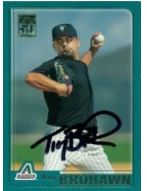
Brian Bark

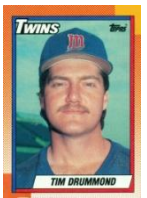
Ken Cloude

He pitched thirteen seasons in the majors for the Phillies (2004-06), Chicago White Sox (2007-13), Atlanta Braves (2014), Cleveland Indians (2015), and Toronto Blue Jays (2016) recording 74 wins with five complete games and one shutout in 243 career games.



Josh Hader

The Most Outstanding Pitcher for the South team in the 2012 Brooks Robinson All-Star Game, Josh Hader was drafted out of Old Mill High School by the Baltimore Orioles. Currently active, he has pitched nine seasons in the majors as a reliever for the Milwaukee Brewers (2017-22), San Diego Padres (2022-23), and Houston Astros (2024-). 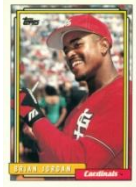
Steve Johnson

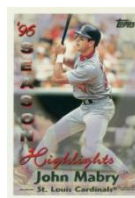
Steve Lombardozzi

He played seven seasons in the majors as an outfielder for the Nationals (2007 and 2009-10), Houston Astros (2012-13), Kansas City Royals (2013-14), and San Francisco Giants (2015), hitting 41 home runs in 441 career games.



Ryan Meisinger

After pitching in the 2012 Brooks Robinson All-Star Game, Ryan Meisinger of Northern High School attended Radford University and was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 2015 amateur draft. He made his major league debut with the Orioles in 2018, pitched for the St. Louis Cardinals in 2020, and the Chicago Cubs in 2021. 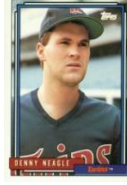
Cody Morris

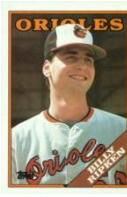
Mike O'Connor

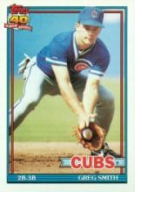
Billy Ripken

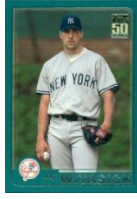
Craig Wilson
